2011 Season Update

Starters Report

In addition to the normal setup and identification procedures, we wanted to make sure every crew completes the "Starters Report" by halftime of your game.

After the first offensive play for each team, the Starters Report can be printed and delivered to the stats crew for cross checking. This report helps to ensure that the starters listed on the printed game book are accurate and players are given credit for starting a game.



The details can be found on page 53 of the Player Participation User Guide, and here:

19. After the first offensive play of each team has been identified, generate the "Starters Report" and save it in PDF format to the USB drive. Select Reports, Starters from the menu-bar or press CTRL+S. When the report shows in the window, click the button to export the report to a PDF document. Insert the USB drive into the laptop and save the Starters.pdf file on the USB drive. Choose Window, Play List from the menu-bar to resume identifying players. Take the USB drive to the stats crew so they can print the report and verify the starters.

Each head statistician has been given a heads-up to expect this report by halftime. Please work with him to ensure that it gets done.

Note: you may be able to print directly to the GSIS printer. Please work with your GSIS stadium technician to setup the printer on the Player Participation laptops if it is not already setup.

New Laptop

We are sending 2 new laptops to each stadium crew. The GSIS and Player Participation crews will each be receiving a new laptop. The computer is an HP EliteBook 8560p that contains a built in numeric keypad as well as an SD card reader. The SD card reader will allow you insert your memory cards directly into the computer without having to use the USB reader. Let us know if you have any questions or comments regarding the new laptops.

Preseason Housekeeping

This should be completed at least 1 week prior to your first preseason game.

1. Gain access to your Player Participation equipment and test the cameras and laptops to ensure they are in proper working order. This is also a good time to give the batteries a fresh charge and format all Compact Flash cards. Also, confirm with your GSIS stadium technician that the updates to GSIS and Player Participation have been applied to your Player Participation laptops. - Obtain game credentials and parking arrangements for each of your crew members
- 3. Scout out the camera locations to ensure everything is ready to go
